

Frequently Asked Questions Regarding First Year Engineering Admission

1. What is CAP?

Ans: - Centralized Admission Process

2. CAP Seats means?

Ans: - The seats filled in through the centralized process of admission carried out by the Competent Authority

3. Facilitation Centre (FC) means?

Ans: - A center where the facilities like filling online forms, verification of documents and grievances resolving are provided.

Deogiri Institute of Engineering and Management Studies is authorized Facilitation Centre (FC) for First Year Engineering Admission.

4. ARC means?

Ans: -ARC means Admission Reporting Centre where candidate must verify his/her original documents and accept the seat allotted by paying the required fees.

5. What are the Basic Eligibility Criteria for admission to First year Engineering?

Ans: - Candidate should be Indian National and Passed HSC or its equivalent examination with Physics and Mathematics as compulsory subjects along with one of the Chemistry or Biotechnology or Biology or Technical Vocational subject or Computer Science or Information Technology or Informatics Practices or Agriculture or Engineering Graphics or Business Studies and obtained at least **45 % /134 marks** and at least **40 %/ 119marks**, in case of Backward Class categories, **Economically Weaker Section** and Persons with Disability category candidates belonging to Maharashtra State, in the above subjects taken together; and the Candidate should have appeared in all the subjects in CET and should obtain non zero score in CET conducted by the Competent Authority; **or**

Passed Diploma in Engineering and Technology and obtained at least 45 % marks and at least 40 % marks, in case of Backward Class categories, Economically Weaker Section and Persons with Disability category candidates belonging to Maharashtra State.

7. "Institutional Quota" means?

Ans: - Seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Institution level also known as **Management Quota**. **Director/Principal** of the institution shall carry out the admissions for these seats. There is no any scholarship facility for students admitted under Institutional Quota.

8. Is there Scholarship facility available in Private/Deemed Universities?

Ans: - As per Government Norms **No Scholarship facility** is available in **Private/Deemed Universities**.

9. Which University in Maharashtra is purely devoted to Technical Education?

Ans: - **Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Technological University, Lonere** is purely devoted to Technical Education in Maharashtra State.

Dr. B.A.T.U. Lonere is **State Level Technical University** and Maximum from Maharashtra are affiliated to Dr. B.A.T.U. Lonere

Major and Minor Facility and Six months Compulsory Industrial Training in final year are some of the advantages of Dr.B.A.T.U.Lonere. The students may have two degrees if they opt for Major and Minor Facility.

10.Is there any Reservation for female candidates?

Ans: - 30% seats in each category of admission are reserved for Female Candidate. There shall be no reservation for Female candidates under Defence, Persons with Disability and Orphan categories.

11.What is the difference between B.E. and B. Tech Degree?

Ans: - In B. Tech, **six months Industrial training** is compulsory for Final Year Students Which **helps the students for Final Placements**.

12.Home University (HU) means?

Ans: - If Candidate has passed out 12th from Junior College in Aurangabad District, then his/her Home University will be Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University.

13.Outside Home University (OHU) means?

Ans: - If Candidate has passed out 12th from Junior College in Aurangabad District, then his/her Home University will be Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University and

for all other colleges other than Jurisdiction of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University his/her candidature will be considered as Outside Home University.

14. All India (AI) Candidature means?

Ans: - The Candidates having Indian Nationality and have appeared for JEE mains are eligible under this Category. **AI seats are not available in Government /Government Aided Institutions.**

15. Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFWS) means?

Ans: - Seats up to maximum **5 percent of sanctioned intake** per course shall be available. If intake of any course is 60 means 3 seats will be available for TFWS. These seats shall be supernumerary (over and above the intake of course) in nature.

The **waiver is limited to only tuition fee** and candidate will have to pay all other fees. The Candidates admitted under this scheme **shall not be allowed to change Institution/course** at any stage under any circumstances.

Only Maharashtra State Candidature candidates having their **parent's annual income less than Rs. 8 Lakh** (Rupees Eight Lakh only) from all sources shall only be eligible for these seats. The candidate shall **submit Income certificate** issued by Appropriate Authority. There is no reservation for female candidates.

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16. Is there any reservation for sons/daughters of Defence service personnel?

Ans: - Five percent (5%) seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institute, subject to a maximum of five (5) seats in each institute coming under CAP shall be reserved for Children's of defence service professionals.

This provision is **NOT available** to the children of **CIVILIAN STAFF** who is working /who has worked in the Indian Defence Service.

There will be no Waiver in any type of fees to admitted candidate under Defence Quota.

17. Is there any Reservation for Persons with Disability Candidate?

Ans: - Five percent (5%) seats of total sanctioned intake of all the Institutions under CAP shall be reserved for Candidates having minimum 40% benchmark disability.

The candidates claiming reservation under this category shall submit the Certificates Clearly mentioning that the extent of disability is not less than 40% (Forty percent) and the disability is permanent in nature, from the competent authority.

There will be no Waiver in any type of fees to admitted candidate under this category.

18. What is EWS?

Ans: -As per provisions in Government Resolutions 10% seats shall be reserved for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) candidates. **The income limit** of Candidate's Parents to become eligible as EWS is maximum **8 lacs**. These seats shall be over & above the sanctioned intake. Candidate must produce EWS certificate issued from Competent Authority (Tahsildar). There is no reservation for female candidates.

19. What are the facilities for EWS Candidate?

Ans: - **The Eligibility criteria is 119 marks in PCM/Biology/Vocational subjects. There is 50% concession in tuition fees for the admitted candidate under EWS quota.**

20. How will one know the authentic fee structure of any Engineering College?

21. Is there Education Loan facility available?

Vidya Lakshmi Portal provides single window for Students to access information about various loan schemes provided by banks and make applications for Educational Loans. If you want to apply for education loan on Vidya Lakshmi portal, you must register on portal Or You may contact the nearest bank. The required documents for educational loan will be provided by concern college.

23. What is course Code or Choice Code?

Ans: -Choice code is nine-digit number, and which will be unique for each course and each digit in choice code has specific meaning.

211461210

- First Two Digits: -University (**21** is university code)
- Next Two Digits: -College (**14** is Institute code)
- Last Five Digit: -Course Code (**61210** is code for Mechanical engineering)
- If last digit is 1 then it will be choice code for TFWS quota.
